The Taylor Memorial Library uses exhibit and display space, bulletin boards and pamphlets in support of its stated mission to bring information, ideas, and people together.

Library Created Displays

The library creates displays to enhance services, programs, and sponsored events. These displays have priority for display space. Displays and exhibits on controversial topics should represent as many opinions toward the topic as possible to create a balanced representation.

Community Displays

In the spirit of community partnerships, the library provides limited, designated spaces for displays of non-commercial purpose for individuals, non-profit organizations, and civic groups. Space is provided on an impartial basis, regardless of beliefs or affiliations of individuals or groups requesting space.

Displays should be educational, informational, civic, historic, artistic, or cultural in nature.

Displays must be appropriate for a wide-range of ages.

The Library Director shall accept or reject materials offered for display based on its suitability and availability.
